Chevron and the Pan American Development Foundation Distribute Emergency Supplies in Haiti

Port-au-Prince, Haiti (September 10, 2008) – Pan American Development Foundation (PADF) and its disaster relief partners distributed food and emergency supplies to evacuees in Bainet, Bellanse, and Côtes de Fer, whose homes were flooded out by Hurricane Gustav, thanks to a cash donation by Chevron. Supplies included rice, spaghetti, oil, soap, and herring to more than 8,000 people.

“Thanks to Chevron’s quick response to Hurricane Gustav, PADF made immediate purchases of emergency supplies in Haiti and delivered them to survivors right away,” says Amy Coughenour, Deputy Director of the Pan American Development Foundation.

Two hurricanes and two tropic storms have ravaged Haiti during the past 30 days. Officials estimate that 1 million have been impacted in a country of 9 million. Haiti’s Southeast coast was hit particularly hard by Hurricane Gustav, causing devastating floods throughout the region. Hurricane Ike followed and caused severe damage to Gonaives. So far the storms have claimed more than 300 lives in Haiti alone.

“When PADF called, Chevron was ready to pitch in,” said Jean Raynald Boyer, Chevron’s retail district manager in Haiti. “Chevron is grateful to have the opportunity to work with PADF in bringing emergency relief to Haiti.”

In addition to Haiti, Chevron and PADF are currently involved in relief efforts in Jamaica, distributing emergency supplies to the survivors of Hurricane Gustav.

These activities are part of PADF’s Disaster Management Emergency Response Program (DMERP), designed to engage the private sector in relief efforts. Chevron was the founding member of the DMERP in 2007.

Chevron and PADF are deeply committed to relief and recovery efforts. In the past year alone, Chevron contributed for emergency relief following Hurricane Dean, Tropical Storm Noel, and after intense flooding in Cabaret. They also recently initiated an agricultural recovery project in Marigot and Côtes de Fer, also in Haiti’s Southeast.

Since the launch of the Disaster Management Emergency Response Program in 2007, Chevron and PADF provided disaster relief materials in the Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Peru, and Nicaragua and supported agricultural recovery projects in Jamaica and Dominica. Chevron will continue to support relief and recovery efforts throughout the 2008 hurricane season.
