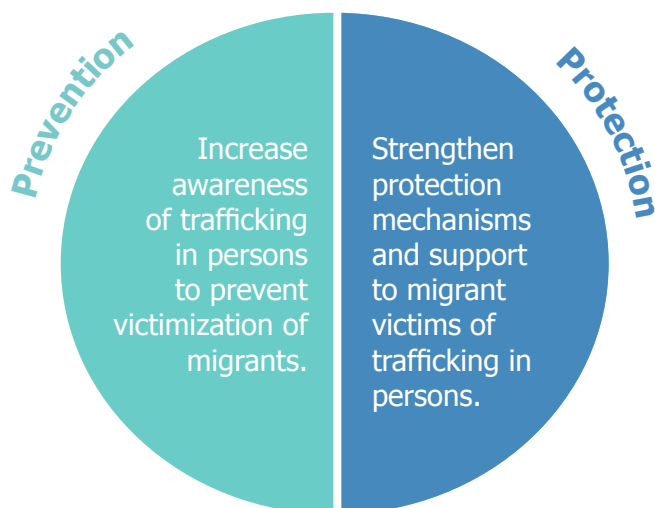
ADDRESSING TRAFFICKING IN PERSONS AMONG MIGRANTS

Through the “Camino Seguro” project, the Pan American Development Foundation (PADF) seeks to prevent trafficking in persons; strengthen institutional frameworks to protect victims and potential victims in the migratory route; and provide services to survivors of trafficking in persons, in Guatemala, Honduras, and southern Mexico.

OBJECTIVE

Strengthen trafficking in persons prevention and protection strategies and services in Mexico, Guatemala and Honduras for migrants and likely migrants.

TO ACHIEVE THIS OBJECTIVE, THE PROJECT WILL WORK ACROSS TWO BROAD PILLARS:

PLANNED ACTIVITIES



- Carry out a regional communications campaign through a community-based, multimedia approach, targeting migrants, likely migrants, and key actors, on the risks and modalities of trafficking in persons along the migratory route.
- Train local leaders in migrant communities of origin as Volunteer Community Facilitators (VCFs) to prevent trafficking in persons in their communities.
- Organize dialogues with key stakeholders to analyze protocols and access points for the identification, reference, and repatriation of migrant victims of trafficking in persons.
- Train protection actors on detection, referral, and repatriation of migrant victims of trafficking in persons.

EXPECTED RESULTS



- 3.5 million individuals reached through communications campaigns.
- 350 local leaders trained and certified as Volunteer Community Facilitators (VCFs) to prevent trafficking in persons along the migratory route.
- 2,000 individuals in communities with high rates of migration informed of trafficking in persons and risks along the migratory route by the VCFs.
- Capacities of protection actors improved to apply identification, referral, and repatriation protocols for migrant victims of trafficking in persons.
- Regional roadmap developed and disseminated to improve cooperation and coordination in the repatriation of migrant victims of trafficking in persons.
- 600 protection actors trained on detection and referral of migrant victims of trafficking in persons.
- 400 protection actors trained on repatriation of migrant victims of trafficking in persons.
- 190 migrant victims of trafficking in persons identified along the migratory route.
- 60 migrant victims of trafficking in persons referred to services.
- 130 migrant victims of trafficking in persons provided with services along the migratory route, through project partners and allies.
